

### **WIAA Provides Opportunities; Structure . . .**

The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) is a voluntary, unincorporated, and nonprofit organization. The Association membership has a diversified membership of public high schools, nonpublic high schools, public middle schools, and nonpublic middle schools. Its purpose is to organize, develop, direct and provide interscholastic athletics for member schools.

There are 514 senior high schools affiliated with the WIAA. The estimated number of student-athletes in athletics is 80,000-85,000 annually.

Governance of the WIAA is performed by the member schools. Rules and policies of the Association are developed, promulgated and implemented by the membership either through membership vote for constitutional issues or through a membership-elected committee structure for sport seasons regulations. Therefore, ownership of the membership's rules and regulations, as well as the responsibility of compliance with them, lies with each member school.

### **The Development of Rules . . .**

As fans watch the games during the tournament, some wonder how the rules of the game and of the WIAA were created.

- ◆ The National Federation of State High School Associations is the authority of the competition rules for sport contests (i.e. uniforms, length of contest, game rules). As a member of the NFHS, the WIAA adheres to those rules as a member in good standing. The WIAA, as well as all state associations in the NFHS, has input with an advisory role in the review and promulgation of the playing rules. The NFHS office is located in Indianapolis, Indiana.The NFHS logo consists of the letters "NFHS" in a bold, white, sans-serif font, set against a blue rectangular background with three diagonal white stripes.
- ◆ For changes to the membership's Constitution, Bylaws and Rules of Eligibility, a vote of the entire membership is required at the Annual Meeting each spring. The Constitution contains information relating to the Association as an organization. The Bylaws encompass information relating to member high schools' responsibility concerning WIAA rules and regulations. The Rules of Eligibility embody information relating to the relationship of the student-athlete to the high school and the WIAA.
- ◆ The Board of Control has the ultimate authority in determining the outcome of sport seasons rule recommendations and regulations. Changes to the sport seasons regulations are advanced through the democratic committee structure. Among the advisory groups that provide input to the Board are the coaches advisory committees for each sport; the sports advisory committee, comprised of school athletic directors from each of the seven districts; the Advisory Council, consisting of school administrators from each elector district; and the executive staff. Other groups with advisory responsibilities include the Medical Advisory Committee, Sportsmanship Committee and the Officials Advisory Committee. The Season Regulations address, among other topics, definition of the sports seasons, participation, contest control and tournament procedures.

Currently, the Association sponsors 24 sports including baseball, basketball, cross country, 8-player, 11-player football, golf, hockey, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, volleyball and wrestling for boys; and basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball for girls.



# 2021 State Preview

**THE DIVISION 1 FIELD:** Appleton North is the top seed. The Lightning advance to the alternate State Tournament having one other appearance at State in the program's history. That came in 2010 when they placed runner-up in Division 1. They qualify this season by edging crosstown rival Appleton East 2-1 in the Kimberly Sectional final. The Lightning are the champions of the Fox Valley Association this season. Second-seeded Waunakee will appear in a State Tournament for the second time and for the first time since the Warriors' only other appearance in 1999. They won the Division 2 championship that season. Waunakee is the representative from the Baraboo Sectional following its 3-2 overtime victory over Madison West in the final. The Warriors participate in the North Division of the Badger Conference, which did not maintain league standings during the alternate season. The third seed, De Pere, makes its eighth overall appearance at State. The previous seven appearances came in the traditional fall season. The most notable experience for the Redbirds came in 1993 when they won the Division 2 championship. They also advanced to the title game the year before and finished runner-up. The Redbirds advance to the alternate State Tournament via a 1-0 shutout over Green Bay Preble in the Manitowoc Lincoln Sectional final. De Pere placed third in the Fox River Classic Conference this spring. Fourth-seeded Racine Horlick qualifies this alternate season, which makes it the 13th State appearance for the program. The Rebels made four straight appearances at State from 1985-88 and five consecutive experiences from 2001-05. The most notable of the previous appearances resulted in a runner-up finish in 2001. They advance to the alternate season State semifinals this spring with a 7-2 victory over Beloit Memorial in the sectional final hosted by Beloit Memorial. The Rebels are members of the Southeastern Conference, which did not maintain conference standings this year.

**DIVISION 2 FIELD:** Top-seeded McFarland is essentially appearing in its third straight State Tournament and its fourth overall. The Spartans have advance to the championship game in each of their past two seasons in Division 3 and have finished runner-up on both occasions. Their first experience in 2013

resulted with a loss in the semifinals. They are the champions of the Rock Valley Conference this spring. Their return to State comes following a 2-0 blanking of DeForest in the sectional final held at DeForest. 2019 Division 3 champion Shorewood qualifies for the alternate season State Tournament, which makes this the fourth time the Greyhounds have advanced to State. They have appeared in the championship game in each of their previous three appearances. The Greyhounds also won the Division 2 championship in 1997 and were runners-up in Division 2 in 2004. They are the champions of the sectional they hosted with a 2-0 victory over Greendale in the final. The Greyhounds are the champions in the Woodland Conference during the alternate regular season. Third-seeded Notre Dame qualifies for a State Tournament for the ninth time with the eight previous appearances coming in the traditional fall. The Tritons' last appearance resulted in a loss in the Division 3 semifinals in 2015. They won back-to-back Division 2 titles in 2007-08 and also won the crown in 2001. In addition, they finished runner-up in Division 2 in their first-ever appearance in 2000 and in 2013. This year, they advance to the alternate season State Tournament as representative out of the Winnebago Lutheran Sectional with a 3-1 win over the host Vikings in the final. The Tritons finished second in the Fox River Classic Conference this spring. Fort Atkinson's appearance in this year's alternate season State Tournament marks the first time the Blackhawks have qualified. They have been issued the #4 seed in the bracket. Their inaugural appearance comes virtue of a 3-1 win over Waupun in the final of the Lomira Sectional. The Blackhawks are members of the South Division of the Badger Conference, which did not maintain conference standings this year.

# Past, Present & Future

The WIAA began sponsoring a tournament program in boys soccer in 1982. Whitefish Bay won the first team championship by blanking Brookfield East 2-0 in the title game.

The first State Tournament was held at Menomonee Falls. It moved to Neenah in 1983 and was held in Madison from 1988-2002. In 2003, the State Tournament was moved to its current location at Uihlein Soccer Park in Milwaukee. In 2020, the State Tournament was conducted at three different locations because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The sites were Mukwonago H.S. for Division 1, Marshfield H.S. for Division 2 and Kewaskum for Division 3.

In 1992, a two-division format was instituted for the first time, with eight schools in the Division 1 State tournament and four schools in Division 2. The three-division format was introduced in 2002. Eight schools qualified in Division 1 and four qualified in Divisions 2 and 3. In 2013, the four-division format was introduced with four teams qualifying in each of the divisions. In 2020, because of the reduction of teams sponsoring the sport in the fall, four teams qualified in three divisions.

Marquette has won 15 championships to lead all schools. The Prairie School and Whitefish Bay are next on the list with seven titles. Xavier has won four titles with Brookfield Central, Brookfield East, Cedarburg, Delavan-Darien,

Madison West, Mount Horeb, Neenah, Notre Dame and Oregon all having won three. Homestead, Muskego, Racine St. Catherine's, Sheboygan Christian, Shorewood, Sturgeon Bay, University School of Milwaukee and Wauwatosa East have each won two.

Marquette has appeared in the most State Tournaments with 19, and Brookfield East is next with 18. Neenah is third on the list of appearances with 17, and Madison West has qualified for State 15 times, and then Whitefish Bay with 14. Middleton and Racine Horlick have appeared in 13 State Tournaments, Cedarburg and Eau Claire Memorial 11. Others with double-figures in appearances are Delavan-Darien, Green Bay Preble, Hudson and The Prairie School with 10.

Marquette is the only school to win five consecutive titles (2014-18), and the Hilltoppers are also the only program to win four straight titles (2000-03) in addition to their five straight titles. Furthermore, Marquette (2010-12) and Whitefish Bay (2015-17) are the only programs to win three in a row. Whitefish Bay has also won an additional two straight championships (1982-83). Other programs to have won back-to-back titles are Madison West (1987-88), Neenah (1985-86), Notre Dame (2007-08), Sheboygan Christian (2002-03), The Prairie School (2010-11) and Xavier (2003-04) have won two straight championships.
