WIAA Provides Opportunities; Structure . . .

The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) is a voluntary, unincorporated, and nonprofit organization. The Association membership has a diversified membership of public high schools, nonpublic high schools, public middle schools, and nonpublic middle schools. Its purpose is to organize, develop, direct and provide interscholastic athletics for member schools.

There are 514 senior high schools affiliated with the WIAA. The estimated number of student-athletes in athletics is 80,000-85,000 annually.

Governance of the WIAA is performed by the member schools. Rules and policies of the Association are developed, promulgated and implemented by the membership either through membership vote for constitutional issues or through a membership-elected committee structure for sport seasons regulations. Therefore, ownership of the membership's rules and regulations, as well as the responsibility of compliance with them, lies with each member school.

The Development of Rules . . .

As fans watch the games during the tournament, some wonder how the rules of the game and of the WIAA were created.

- ◆ The National Federation of State High School Associations is the authority of the competition rules for sport contests (i.e. uniforms, length of contest, game rules). As a member of the NFHS, the WIAA adheres to those rules as a member in good standing. The WIAA, as well as all state associations in the NFHS, has input with an advisory role in the review and promulgation of the playing rules. The NFHS office is located in Indianapolis, Indiana.
- ◆ For changes to the membership's Constitution, Bylaws and Rules of Eligibility, a vote of the entire membership is required at the Annual Meeting each spring. The Constitution contains information relating to the Association as an organization. The Bylaws encompass information relating to member high schools' responsibility concerning WIAA rules and regulations. The Rules of Eligibility embody information relating to the relationship of the student-athlete to the high school and the WIAA.
- ◆ The Board of Control has the ultimate authority in determining the outcome of sport seasons rule recommendations and regulations. Changes to the sport seasons regulations are advanced through the democratic committee structure. Among the advisory groups that provide input to the Board are the coaches advisory committees for each sport; the sports advisory committee, comprised of school athletic directors from each of the seven districts; the Advisory Council, consisting of school administrators from each elector district; and the executive staff. Other groups with advisory responsibilities include the Medical Advisory Committee, Sportsmanship Committee and the Officials Advisory Committee. The Season Regulations address, among other topics, definition of the sports seasons, participation, contest control and tournament procedures.

Currently, the Association sponsors 24 sports including baseball, basketball, cross country, 8-player, 11-player football, golf, hockey, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, volleyball and wrestling for boys; and basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball for girls.

2020 State Preview

THE DIVISION 1 FIELD: Marquette is the top seed. The Hilltoppers advance to the State Tournament in pursuit of their 15th State championship. They have now qualified for State in six of the past seven seasons and for a membership-leading 19 times. Their championship total of 14 is also a membership record for championships won. The Hilltoppers won five consecutive titles from 2014-18 and a string of four crowns from 2000-03. They also won three straight titles from 2010-12 to go with championships in 2005 and 2008. In addition, they finished runner-up in 2004 and 2007. Prior to joining the WIAA, the Hilltoppers won 14 titles as a former member of WISAA. Those came in 1974, 1979, 1981, 1982, 1984-86, 1989-90, 1992, 1994-97. They qualify this year by edging Whitefish Bay 4-3 in overtime in the Whitefish Bay Sectional final. The Hilltoppers are the champions of the Greater Metro Conference this season. Second-seeded Arrowhead qualifies for State for the seventh time and for the first time since 2017 when the Warhawks finished runners-up. They also advanced to the championship game and finished runners-up in 2015 and 1985. Arrowhead is the representative from the Muskego Sectional following its 1-0 shootout victory over Hortonville in the final. The Warhawks finished runner-up in the Classic Eight Conference behind Oconomowoc this season. The third seed, Elkhorn, moves up a division after qualifying in Division 2 last season. The Elks are making their fourth overall appearance at State. Their most notable experience was a runner-up finish in 2016. The Elks first tournament appearance in 2011 came in Division 1, which resulted in a loss in the quarterfinals. This season, they cruised to a 6-0 win over Muskego to advance from the sectional final hosted by the Warriors. They are the champions of the Southern Lakes Conference this year. Fourth-seeded Hudson qualifies for the State Tournament for the 10th time and for the first time since 2007. The Raiders furthest advancement at State was to the semifinals in 1993. They blanked Wausau West 1-0 in the Wausau West Sectional final to earn their return to State.

DIVISION 2 FIELD: Top-seeded Delavan-Darien qualifies for first time since 2017. The Comets are shooting for their fourth

State title. They won Division 3 championships in 2014 and 2016, and they captured a Division 2 crown in 2000. In addition to their four titles, they have five runner-up finishes on their ledger, including four in Division 2 in 1994, 1996, 1998 and 2005, and one in Division 3 in 2017. This past weekend, they shutout Grafton 1-0 to advance from the Kewaskum Sectional. The Comets are the runners-up in the Southern Lakes Conference this season behind Division 1 qualifier Elkhorn. Roncalli/Two Rivers is the #2 seed in the bracket. They are making the co-op program's first-ever State appearance. The Jets downed Seymour in the sectional final played at Seymour to advance to the State semifinals. They are the champions of the East Central Conference this fall. Third-seeded Medford will be embarking on the program's first ever State Tournament appearance. The Raiders earned their way into the qualifying field by advancing via a 6-5 shootout after tying Rice Lake 0-0 in the sectional final held at Medford. The Raiders finished runners-up in the Great Northern Conference this fall behind Rhinelander. Fourth-seeded Sauk Prairie returns to the State Tournament for the first time since 1996 and for the fourth time overall. The Eagles captured the Division 2 that season after their previous two experiences, which came in 1992 and 1995, resulted in losses in semifinals. They defeated Seymour 3-0 in the final of the Seymour Sectional to return to the semifinals.

THE DIVISION 3 FIELD: Last year's Division 4 runner-up The Prairie School was issued the top seed in the bracket. The Hawks return to the tournament field for the 10th time overall and for the third time in the last four seasons. They have advanced to the championship game in each of their previous nine experiences at State, including six championships. The Hawks won back-to-back titles on two different occasions. They captured Division 3 titles in 2004-05 and then duplicated the feat in 2010-11. They also won Division 4 crowns in 2014 and 2017. Their other two experiences in the final resulted in runner-up finishes in Division 3 in 2003 and in Division 4 in 2014 and 2019. Prior to joining the WIAA as a former member of WISAA, the Hawks finished runner-up four times—in 1985, 1993, 1995 and 1996. Last weekend, they defeated Lake Mills

4-0 in the sectional final hosted by the Hawks to continue their pursuit of a seventh title. They finished first in the Metro Classic Conference this season. University School of Milwaukee was issued the #2 seed in the bracket. The Wildcats are making their fifth State Tournament appearance overall and the second in the past three seasons. They have won two Division 4 State titles. Their first came in 2013 followed by their most recent in 2018. They also have a runner-up finish in 2015 on their resume. The Wildcats advance to the State semifinals this year with a 2-0 shutout over Oostburg in the Kohler Sectional final. They captured the Midwest Classic Conference crown this fall. Third-seeded St. Lawrence Seminary is a first-time qualifier to the State Tournament. The Hilltoppers earned the berth following a 5-1 victory over St. Mary Catholic in the Kiel Sectional final. They finished atop the standings of the Wisconsin Flyway Conference this year. Arcadia will also be experiencing its inaugural appearance in the State Tournament following the Raiders' 4-1 triumph over Columbus Catholic in the sectional final played in Marshfield. They are the fourth seed in the bracket after playing an independent schedule this fall.

Past, Present & Future

The WIAA began sponsoring a tournament program in boys soccer in 1982. Whitefish Bay won the first team championship by blanking Brookfield East 2-0 in the title game.

The first State Tournament was held at Menomonee Falls. It moved to Neenah in 1983 and was held in Madison from 1988-2002. In 2003, the State Tournament was moved to Uihlein Soccer Park in Milwaukee.

In 2020, the State Tournament was conducted at three different locations because of COVID-19 mitigation guidelines. The tournament sites are high schools in Kewaskum, Marshfield and Mukwonago.

In 1992, a two-division format was instituted for the first time, with eight schools in the Division 1 State tournament and four schools in Division 2. The three-division format was introduced in 2002. Eight schools qualified in Division 1 and four qualified in Divisions 2 and 3. In 2013, the four-division format was introduced with four teams qualifying in each of the divisions. In 2020, because of the reduction of teams sponsoring the sport in the fall, four teams qualified in three divisions.

Marquette has won 14 championships to lead all schools. Whitefish Bay is next on the list with seven titles, and The Prairie School has won six. Xavier has won four titles with

Brookfield Central, Brookfield East, Cedarburg, Delavan-Darien, Madison West, Mount Horeb, Neenah, Notre Dame and Oregon all having won three. Homestead, Muskego, Racine St. Catherine's, Sheboygan Christian, Shorewood, Sturgeon Bay, University School of Milwaukee and Wauwatosa East have each won two.

Marquette has appeared in the most State Tournaments with 19. Brookfield East is next on the list of appearances with 18. Neenah has 17, and Madison West has qualified for State 15 times, and then Whitefish Bay with 14. Middleton has appeared in 13 State Tournaments, Racine Horlick 12, Cedarburg and Eau Claire Memorial 11. Delavan-Darien, Green Bay Preble, Hudson and The Prairie School have 10.

Marquette is the only school to win five consecutive titles (2014-18), and the Hilltoppers are also the only program to win four straight titles (2000-03) in addition to their five straight titles. Furthermore, Marquette (2010-12) and Whitefish Bay (2015-17) are the only programs to win three in a row. Whitefish Bay has also won an additional two straight championships (1982-83). Other programs to have won back-to-back titles are Madison West (1987-88), Neenah (1985-86), Notre Dame (2007-08), Sheboygan Christian (2002-03), The Prairie School (2010-11) and Xavier (2003-04) have won two straight championships.

ASSISTANT REFEREE SIGNALS



Throw-in
(The flag should not be brought across the body. Appropriately, the flag should be switched to the appropriate hand.)



Substitution
(Hold the flag above the head as shown until acknowledged by the referee; 2. Wave flag; 3. Point the flag in the direction where the free kick will take place.)



Foul
(1. Hold the flag vertically until acknowledged by the referee; 2. Wave flag; 3. Point the flag in the direction where the free kick will take place.)



Corner kick
(Assistant referee should point to the nearest corner.)



Goal kick
(Assistant referee should point to the goal area.)



Stop play – Offside
(Assistant referee should indicate he/she has seen an offside with the right arm.)



Offside free kick
(When the referee stops play, the assistant referee indicates position near the center of the field.)



Offside free kick
(When the referee stops play, the assistant referee indicates position on the near side of the field.)


